

A Message from the Chair

Welcome to the 2015 Report to the Community from the Grand Bend Community Foundation!

The title of this report, "Setting the Stage," refers to one of our major projects in 2015, the Rotary Community Stage (see page 2). But it also describes what we do as a Foundation every year—we set the stage for a vibrant community by providing leadership and financial support to charities that are doing wonderful work.

As Chair, it's my great honour to thank the people who make it all possible – our donors. To all those who contributed this year and in past years, thank you for your generosity, community spirit, and vision.

I also want to thank our hard-working board members, volunteers and community partners, and of course, the organizations we provide funding to.

I'm happy to report that during 2015, our endowment funds grew by approximately 3.9% and we maintained administrative costs at less than 2%. In total, we granted \$122,685 (including flow-through funds of \$64,785) to a wide variety of community organizations (see page 3).

As the Foundation moves forward, one of our goals will be helping Grand Bend become an age-friendly community. An age-friendly community is one that anticipates and responds to age-related needs and promotes the participation of older adults. As Canada's population ages and Grand Bend continues to be a magnet for active retirees, this is a natural focus. You'll be hearing more about this concept in the months ahead.

Of course the Foundation will also be supporting other initiatives serving people in our area across the lifespan.

As always, you can help to set the stage for these activities by giving back to our community through the Foundation (see page 4). Thank you for sharing our vision of "caring people collaborating to build an inclusive, sustainable community."

Building for the Arts: The Rotary Community Stage Project

It all started with a simple idea – music at sunset on Grand Bend's beautiful main beach.

A small grant from the Lambton Creative County Fund launched the project, "Summer Sunset Sounds," in 2014, and a series of concerts were held on Sunday nights that summer. A temporary stage was created using risers borrowed from a local school. The response was enthusiastic, says organizer and local business owner Glenn Baillie. "As the summer went on, the concerts got more and more successful. It was soon obvious that we needed a permanent performance venue."

Meanwhile a group of citizens were working with the Foundation to identify a high-impact project in the community. Jim Southcott, a community booster who has provided leadership for many projects, put forward the idea of a permanent stage at the beach. "Jim loves the history of the area and the old Casino dancehall that was a big part of the beach in the past," says David Campbell, Executive Director of the Foundation. Southcott took the idea to the Grand Bend Rotary Club and the Foundation, and things began to move quickly.

To launch the effort, the Foundation and the Rotary Club each made a three-year commitment of \$45,000. Within weeks, individuals, businesses, and community groups had stepped forward to contribute. Rotary partnered with the Municipality of Lambton Shores to apply for a federal grant, receiving \$67,000.

By March a shovel was in the ground. The new Stage will be complete in June. Baillie says there's lots of entertainment on tap for this summer, and big plans for the future. The stage will be an economic driver for the community, Southcott believes, attracting visitors and enhancing lifestyle for residents.

"This is the way things happen in Grand Bend," says Southcott. "When a good idea comes along, people get behind it and put their hands in their pockets. The Foundation played an outstanding leadership role."
