These are just some of the ways Grand Bend Community Foundation has helped our community be stronger and more caring during 2017. My heartfelt thanks to all those whose legacy gifts enabled these and other grants.

In 2017, we granted more than \$75,000 from our permanent endowment funds, and facilitated nearly \$100,000 in grants to local charities. At the same time, our total assets grew to \$2.56 million, and administrative costs remained below 2%.

One of the most exciting developments of the past year was the growth of the South Huron Community Fund. It has been a great

pleasure to provide support to the dedicated group of people who are developing the fund. We look forward to providing a home for other growing community funds in future.

This year was one of change at the Foundation. Our long-time Executive Director, David Campbell, announced his retirement, effective March 31, 2018. David has left the Foundation stronger and better in every respect. We are grateful for his commitment to the community foundation movement and to our local community.

We were deeply saddened to lose former Foundation Chair Hank Winters in early 2018. Hank was an energetic and enthusiastic leader who enriched Grand Bend in countless ways. Hank's legacy gift, and the many contributions made in his name, will help keep his memory alive.

I am completing my term as Chair this year. It has been wonderful to learn more about this generous and caring community. I have had the pleasure of working with a dedicated group of community leaders on our Board of Directors. I welcome Penny Nelligan into this leadership role. Penny brings knowledge, experience, energy, and new ideas. I know the Foundation will thrive under her leadership.

She will be ably assisted by Pat Morden, our new Executive Director.

As Chair I've seen the impact of the Foundation close up. We enable donors to make visionary gifts. We support innovative charities who are doing great things. We manage our assets for long-term growth. Ultimately, we touch the lives of everyone in our

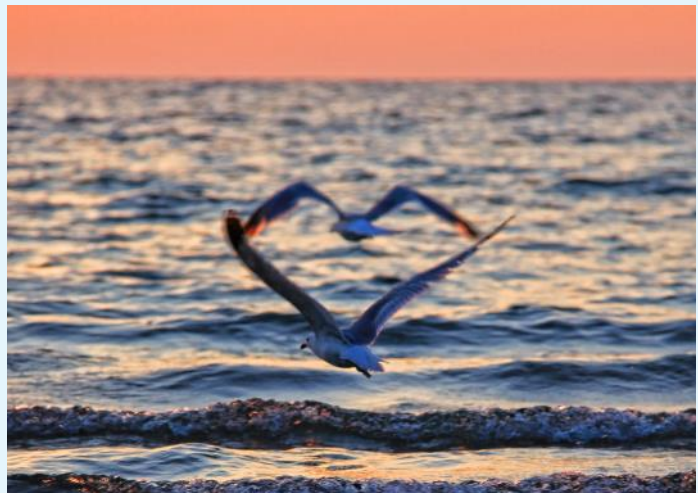
Why Give to a Community Foundation?
